

## Erasmus Accommodation Options

The information below is intended to help you find suitable accommodation for the duration of your course at the University of Gloucestershire.

### Full year Erasmus students 2017/18

**Halls:** Full year Erasmus students can apply for halls accommodation, please ensure you apply by Thursday 4th May 2017 to be guaranteed a room in Halls of Residence. The contract will run for 40 weeks and there is no early release. If successful, you will need to electronically sign the contract and pay a booking fee of £200 within 7 days of receiving your room offer. This amount will be deducted from your total rental amount. Rent is paid in three instalments. You can find further details on this hall of residence on the website.

**University approved housing:** These are houses let by landlords who register with the university or local agents and students share with each other. You usually have to sign a contract and most landlords signed up with the University will want to sign people up for the whole year. You can find out more [here](#).

**Lodgings:** These are rooms in a landlord's own home. Most lodgings are self-catered but there may be the option to include some meals. You will not need to sign a fixed contract so this type of accommodation is more flexible. You can find out more [here](#).

### Semester one students 2017/18

**Halls:** We have a limited amount of halls of residence rooms specifically available for you. If you are a new single semester Erasmus student entering your studies at the university, who has firmly accepted their offer, you can apply online [here](#). Please note that these rooms are allocated on a first come first served basis so the earlier you apply the better chance you have of being allocated a Halls room. If you do not require Halls or that are full, below are the other accommodation options available to you.

**Approved housing:** These are houses let by landlords who register with the university or local agents and students share with each other. You usually have to sign a contract and most landlords signed up with the University will want to sign people up for the whole year. So for Semester one students it may be necessary to book through local letting agents who would offer a 6 month contract.

**Lodgings:** These are rooms in a landlord's own home. Most lodgings are self-catered but there may be the option to include some meals. You will not need to sign a fixed contract so this type of accommodation is more flexible. You can find out more [here](#).

### Semester two students 2017/18

**Halls:** There are no allocated semester two rooms in halls, however there can be voids in residences at this time of year, so you are able to apply for halls of residence. The contract will run for the full

period of semester two and there is no early release. A £200 booking fee will need to be paid once you receive your room offer. Rent is paid in one instalment.

**Approved housing:** These are houses let by landlords who register with the university or local agents and students share with each other. You usually have to sign a contract until the end of the academic year.

**Lodgings:** These are rooms in a landlord's own home. Most lodgings are self-catered but there may be the option to include some meals. You will not need to sign a fixed contract so this type of accommodation is more flexible.
