

## Partnership Bursary 2017/18

The University will award a Partnership Bursary of £500 in the first year, paid as a cash award, for each full-time student entering their first year of undergraduate study, from a Strategic Alliance College or Compact Partner institution.

Strategic Alliance Colleges and Compact Partner institutions are local colleges/schools that the University has established links with (a full list of Partners is available below).

### Eligibility

Eligible students will:

- Reside in the UK or EU
- be liable for the full fees of £9250\*
- be in receipt of means tested support and assessed by a Student Finance Authority (e.g. Student Finance England) as having a house hold income of less than £42,875 and consented to share their/their sponsors household income with their Student Finance Authority by 20 October 2017.
- have successfully completed a full-time, further education course, lasting a minimum of one year, no earlier than academic year 2015/16
- not hold an equivalent or higher qualification i.e. you must not already hold a qualification that is equivalent or higher to the degree that you will be undertaking
- not be eligible for the Partnership Bursary if they are awarded the Attainment or Mature Student Bursaries

### Further information

Cash awards are paid directly into students bank accounts in three instalments; 25% by the end of November 2017, 25% in February 2018 and 50% in May 2018.

The University will terminate the award for any student who ceases to be an enrolled student of the University of Gloucestershire. If either the award or enrolment are terminated for any reason, the student must repay the University any monies overpaid, based on a pro-rata calculation from the date of the termination.

Unless otherwise stated, the Partnership Bursary is only eligible to students studying on courses delivered by the University of Gloucestershire.

An award holder who transfers from full-time to part-time enrolment will cease to be eligible to hold the award.

Students can only receive the Partnership Bursary if they are not eligible for any other bursaries.
