Additional to this University time is a further 78 hours of supervised learning in practice. Students' competencies in practice will be supervised and verified by their DMP.

Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) (formally Criminal Records Bureau check)

NMC Standards (2006) require nurses to have the “necessary clinical governance infrastructure in place (including a Criminal Records Bureau check) to enable the registrant to prescribe once they are qualified to do so”.

The NMC (circular 09/ 2007) now require “all registrants must have an up to date DBS check within the last 3 years before they commence educational preparation to prescribe as a Nurse Independent Prescriber.”

The NMC require registrants to provide evidence of a recent DBS to the HEI on application to the educational programme.

The University of Gloucestershire requires all students to have completed the online Enhanced Vulnerable Adults and Children DBS application form and hold current DBS certification, to enable them to study at the university. However if you are already registered for online Enhanced Vulnerable Adults and Children DBS certification using the update method, you must provide the certificate upon commencing the course on Induction (Information provided at interview).
