

# Paramedic Science application

Here is a simple and easy guide to your Paramedic Science application.

## Apply through UCAS

All applications to the University of Gloucestershire for full-time study must be made online through **UCAS**. The application includes details of the qualifications you are taking, or have taken, your personal statement and your reference.

We will be looking for applicants committed to paramedic science.. This must be clearly demonstrated in the 'personal statement' section of the application form by saying why you want to study paramedic science and stating any relevant work experience that you have gained to date.

## Entry requirements

In order to pass our initial assessment of your application, you must meet the minimum requirements. The university considers a wide range of qualifications for entry:

### GCSE

A minimum of 5 subjects at grade C or above, or grade 4 under newly reformed GCSE grading, to include English Language, Mathematics, and a Science or equivalent.

### English language requirement

If your first language is not English, you should have a minimum IELTS score of 7.0 or above with a minimum of 7.0 in all sections of the test.

### A-Level subjects

Grade C or above in a Science or Social Science subject. Points from A-Level General Studies and AS-Level subjects (not taken on to full A-Level) can also count towards your overall tariff points.

You must have a minimum of two A-Levels.

### Specific subjects

Subjects that meet the Science/Social Science requirement for this course:

Biology, Applied Biology, Human Biology, Chemistry, Health and Social Care, Mathematics, Psychology, Applied Science, Science (Biology route), Science (Chemistry route), Science in Society, Sociology, Sport and Physical Education, Sports Studies.

### Edexcel (BTEC) Diploma

To include six units in a Science or Social Science subject. Access: Achievement of the Access to HE Diploma.

If you an international student please see the specific entry requirements (overseas fee status).

### We welcome mature applicants (aged 21 or over)

If you do not meet the minimum academic entry requirements but have significant life and/or work experience, you will be considered on an individual basis. However, you still need to meet the GCSE English and Maths requirements, and should have evidence of recent study in a science/health-related subject area or functional skills recognised as equivalent academically by the university.

## Interview

We will conduct an (approximately) 15-minute interview in which you will be asked a series of questions related to your values and beliefs. This is also an opportunity for you to ask the team any questions you may have and we would usually give a presentation on the programme. We want you to feel as relaxed as possible during the interview, so we keep it as informal as we can. The first question you will be asked focusses on your understanding of holistic care and professionalism; the second on your adaptability; and the third on your ability to meet deadlines.

During clearing weeks we may elect to undertake telephone interviews and can often offer video interviews if circumstances demand it.

## Your offer

If you successfully pass the interview stage of the application we will then send you your offer along with a handy guide with instructions on how to complete the application process including; DBS check, health check and submitting evidence of your qualifications.

## Enrol

Once all of your health assessments have been completed and your qualifications are verified you can enrol with us.
