If you are undertaking a Master's by Research, the modules will need to be selected against your record for that programme of study. Students undertaking a PhD will find that they also have a parallel programme called Postgraduate Certificate in Research Methods. Modules must be selected against that programme of study rather than the PhD programme.
